The Wise Men and the Star

"Then Herod, when he had privily called the wise men, enquired of them diligently what time the star appeared." (Matthew 2:7) The name Magi comes from the Greek word magoi. It is translated as wise men in the King James Versio and is used four times in the Christmas story. It is uncertain what the wise men of the Christmas story identified as the star when they asked, "Where is he that is born King of the Jews? For we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him." (Matthew 2:2)



Answer Key:

- 1. Herod commanded that all baby boys under the age of two be killed. This would indicate that Jesus had been born up to two years previously. The wise men did not arrive at the same time as the shepherds. The Bible indicates that Jesus was living in a house. (Matthew 2:11)
